**BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA,
CIRCLE TEN COUNCIL** **\$1,500**

Helps prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law. **Hopkins County had 46 youth participating in 2020.**

BRIGHT STAR BASEBALL **\$1,000**

Provides a baseball league for children and adults with special needs. **Bright Star Baseball looks forward to playing baseball with players and buddies in Fall 2021.**

CANHELP **\$18,250**

Provides compassionate, comprehensive solutions that empower the underserved in our community to make positive, lasting changes in their lives. **CANHelp served 940 families in 2020.**

**ETCADA (EAST TEXAS COUNCIL
ON ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE)** **\$1,500**

Provides recovery support services and reduces substance use through education and intervention. **ETCADA served 341 people in Hopkins County in 2020.**

**HERITAGE CHRISTIAN
COUNSELING CENTER** **\$8,000**

Provides mental health counseling to those unable to obtain these services due to lack of finances or insurance. **Heritage Christian Counseling Center served 313 individuals in Hopkins County in 2020.**

HOPKINS COUNTY 4-H **\$2,000**

Prepares youth across the county to meet the challenges of childhood, adolescence, and adulthood, through a coordinated, long-term progressive series of educational experiences that enhance life skills and develop social, emotional, physical, and cognitive competencies. **There are currently 968 students who are benefitting from 4-H activities in Hopkins County.**

**HOPKINS COUNTY CHRISTIAN
ALLIANCE ON BEHALF OF
COMMUNITY CUPBOARD** **\$7,000**

Provides bi-weekly food assistance to families in need. Also provides up to an additional 35 pounds of food for eligible clients aged 60 or over. **Through Community Cupboard, Christian Alliance served 18,720 individuals in 2020.**

**HOPKINS COUNTY
COMMUNITY CHEST** **\$40,000**

Seeks to help Hopkins County residents who are at or below the poverty level meet basic needs of food, shelter, and gain access to medical and dental care. **Community Chest helped 1,560 individuals in Hopkins County in 2020.**

JEHOVAH JIREH FOOD PANTRY **\$3,000**

Provides nutritious food, promotes the value of nutrition, increases self-sufficiency and instills hope by helping to ensure food relief has a more meaningful and enduring impact to individuals and families in need. **Jehovah Jireh served 9,295 individuals in Hopkins County in 2020.**

LAKE COUNTRY CASA **\$10,000**

Provides trained volunteer advocates for abused or neglected children involved in the Family Courts with the goal of

achieving a permanent living arrangement which will serve that child's best interest.

Lake Country Casa served 77 children in Hopkins County in 2020.

LAKES REGIONAL COMMUNITY CENTER ON BEHALF OF OUR PLACE \$4,000

Provides a safe, developmentally appropriate environment for individuals with intellectual development disabilities. The Day Program seeks to enhance quality of life through meaningful activities, community integration and social interaction. **Our Place, located in Sulphur Springs, provided services to 25 people in 2020.**

MEAL-A-DAY OF SULPHUR SPRINGS \$8,000

Provides hot nutritious lunches 5 days a week, including most holidays, to senior citizens. Meals are available for a nominal charge, if seniors can pay, and meals are also delivered on a regular basis to those who are ill, disabled, or homebound and have no one to prepare meals for them. **Meal-A-Day served 40,562 meals in 2020.**

NETCAC (NORTHEAST TEXAS CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER, INC.) \$3,500

Coordinates and provides services for child abuse victims including forensic interviews, mental health therapy, case tracking, family advocacy, parent education, personal safety programs, and support groups. **NETCAC served 80 individuals from Hopkins County in 2020.**

SAFE-T (SHELTER AGENCIES FOR FAMILIES IN EAST TEXAS) \$4,000

Provides services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. The center provides education, violence prevention services, and crisis intervention to victims of family violence, sexual assault, and child

abuse. **SAFE-T served 376 clients in Hopkins County in 2020.**

SHADOW RANCH THERAPEUTIC RIDING CENTER \$4,000

Increases the quality of life of kids and adults dealing with disabilities and/or disabling situations in their lives. **Shadow Ranch served 30 riders in 2020.**

SULPHUR SPRINGS SYMPHONY LEAGUE \$1,000

Seeks to educate students in developing their cultural understanding and improving their social skills by encouraging music instruction, funding music scholarships,

providing stringed instruments to the school district, and presenting live orchestra performances at student concerts. **Approximately 800 students attended the Children's Concert in 2020.**

TEEN COURT **\$4,000**

Provides teenage misdemeanor offenders an opportunity to accept responsibility for their actions by participating in the judicial process and performing community service work. Teen Court also encourages volunteerism among teens to work the court as a juror, bailiff, clerk, or attorney. Students that volunteer for these duties are given points toward scholarships at the end of each school year. **Teen Court served 70 students in 2020.**

THE DINNER BELL **\$4,000**

Provides a weekly hot meal to any person in need. **The Dinner Bell provided 7,175 meals in 2020.**

UNITED WAY WORLDWIDE **\$3,000**

Works cooperatively with local United Ways to make the local United Way movement more viable. **Membership in United Way Worldwide is required for all local United Way organizations.**

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES **\$22,250**

Includes salary for part-time secretary, supplies, utilities, annual audit, postage, and campaign materials.
